New Volunteer at Fiske Library



If you should happen to come to the Fiske Library on one of its regular open Wednesdays, you might meet a long-time volunteer, Linda Blais, who sits just past the computer where you scan your driver's license to check in and two desks down, our newest volunteer, Kim Bishop.

Kim started volunteering on Wednesdays back in July of 2023 after visiting a Pioneer Building Open House. While there she saw the Fiske Library sign. Since she was interested in genealogy, librarianship, and information science, she wanted to see what the library had to offer.

While checking out the Fiske Library website she noticed that volunteers were needed, so she called the phone number listed and reached Fiske Genealogical Foundation President David Brazier. After a long conversation, David was able to convince her that with her deep-seated interest and research in information science and association with The Colonial Dames, she could do much more than shelve books. He set up several virtual sessions to start training her to work in the World Cat system that Fiske uses to manage its collection.

Since the Wednesday library hours fit her schedule, she started to come to the library each week to continue her training and to do the computer data work needed to catalog the many books accumulated during the COVID pandemic. She has also taken on printing out new shelf labels for the faded ones that Linda and other volunteers have found when putting the newly processed books in their proper spot or while re-shelving books consulted by visitors.

Be sure to check out the list of new books that Linda and Kim have processed and that now grace Fiske Library's shelves. This work was formerly done by Jimi Vernie and Gary Zimmerman. Thanks to them for their many years of service to the library laying the foundation for what is being accomplished now.

New Online

23,000 Previously Unavailable Cork County Burial Records Now Available Online

Cork County Council's Skibbereen Heritage Centre [Ireland] has uploaded 23,000 previously unavailable Cork County burial register records from 18 graveyards to its online database. This brings the total number of burial records now available on their website www.skibbheritage.com to over 82,700, all of which are available to access free of charge from anywhere in the world.

Scam Obituaries

Hitting a new low in exploitation, scammers are creating fake obituaries and posting them online even before family members are able to do so. The obituaries are created by AI using the deceased's real name and any facts they can find or make up. Dates, locations etc. may not be accurate. The point, of course, is to profit off memorial donations, fake flower ordering links, fake gift sites, phishing for your credit card info and/or transmitting malware.

Genealogists will need to be extra careful when seeking current obituaries. It is recommended that one contact the actual funeral home to confirm an obituary's legitimacy.


The Half-Price Sale is still on while the inventory is being completed. Prices listed are retail; the sale price is half that amount – a real bargain!
