## **Karen Bridgeman Collection**

## **Description:**

The Bridgeman Collection consists of 8 boxes of genealogical materials loosely sorted by surname. The collection focuses on ancestors of her mother's Eneix/Enochs family from Illinois and Pennsylvania and her father's Cook family from Sheffield, England, and their cousins. The file boxes have been left in the original order, indexed by surnames. Named folders contain many family group sheets, census records, cemetery records, photo copies of wills and deeds for the named families. They also still retain research notes, correspondence and photos. The individual folders might benefit from additional sorting and culling, but provide a rich bounty of information on the named families.

## **Biography:**

Karen Elizabeth Cooke Bridgeman was born 31 January 1941 in Seattle. She married Chester Lewis Bridgeman Jr. on 19 June 1959. They were divorced in 1962. Karen died in Seattle 22 March, 2005 of colon cancer while still actively working on her family history.

Karen was a student, researcher and volunteer at the Fiske Library for many years. She assembled a book for family members and the family donated her collection to the Fiske Library.
