WORLD WAR II MILITARY DATABASES

The National Archives offers five separate databases for searching information about personnel involved in World War II. The most extensive file contains approximately 9 million names of men and women who enlisted in the United States Army (including the Women's Auxiliary Corps) between 1938 and 1946.

Searches are done easily and may return the name of the enlistee, the serial number, the state and county of residence at the time of enlistment, their age, place and year of birth, and the date of enlistment. Some of the records also include civilian occupation, marital status, education, and (before 1943, height and weight) and (after 1945) their military occupational specialty.

The same website also offers you a chance to make separate searches of World War II Prisoners of War, Prisoners of the Japanese, Japanese-American internees, and of Naval Intelligence personnel in Naval Group China. There are extensive "FAQ files" to explain the content of each database and the source of the information as it came to the National Archives.

There are really two separate data files in the largest database:

- Army enlistment records, and
- Army Reserve Corps records.

During World War II the Army created an IBM punch card record for each enlistee at the time of enlistment or re-enlistment. After the end of the

war, the Army microfilmed the punched cards in serial number order and destroyed the original cards. The database contains only enlisted men, not officers.

In 1959, 1586 rolls of microfilm were transferred to the National Archives. The microfilm was in poor condition and only contained images of the punch cards.

In 1994, the National Archives converted the microfilm images to a contemporary digital format in an effort to support the military records reconstruction project that was trying to recover records lost in the 1973 fire at the National Military Personnel Records Center in St Louis.

About 13% of the microfilmed cards (representing about 1.5 million cards) were in such poor condition that they would not scan into the electronic

file. About 35% of the Enlistment Record cards had some scanning error due to the poor condition of the microfilm; however, many of the resulting missing characters can be supplied by reading the information in "context."

Only 4.7% of the records had any character error in the name field and 1.3% had character errors in the serial number field. The National Archives is clear that it preserves the integrity of records as they are transferred from other Federal agencies, but it does not revise or add to those records, so there will be no effort to correct or revise the accessioned records.

NEW RESOURCE FOR CANADIAN GENEALOGY

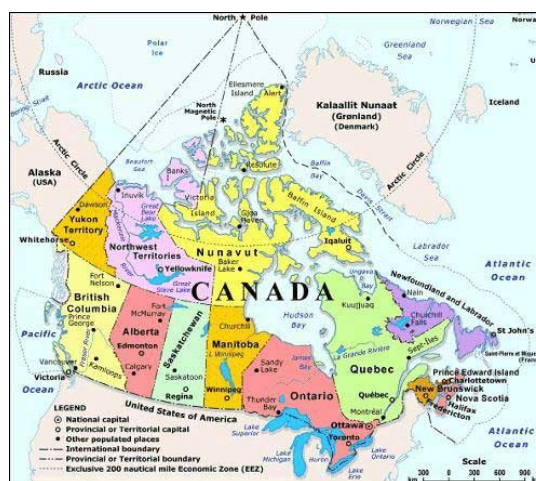
David Obee has created a new website for locating the best resources for genealogical research in Canada. It is organized very logically and offers a brief description of each site. For each province, links are sorted into three major categories: the major sites for research data, the best archives and libraries, and then links to local genealogical societies in that province. Take a look for yourself at www.cangenealogy.com.

The entries on this website have been selected for their value to genealogical research; the site does not try to list every webpage out there that you might find in a Google or Yahoo search.

Obee has written six books for Canadian genealogists and over the past nine years he has given more than 200 talks at seminars and genealogical society meetings. He is one of the owners of Interlink Bookshop and Genealogical Services in Victoria, BC. He currently serves as President of the Federation of East European Family History Societies. He also is currently the editorial page editor for the

Victoria Times Colonist newspaper.

**LIBRARY IRELAND OFFERS
ON-LINE BACKGROUND
BOOKS**

There are a number of resources for background to your Irish research to be found at www.libraryireland.com.

These books are transcriptions rather than images of the original texts, but they are easy to read in your web browser. Titles include, among others, “The Irish In America” by John Francis Maguire (published 1868), Samuel Lewis’s “A Topographical Dictionary of Ireland” (1887), and Hugh Forde’s “Sketches of Olden Days in Northern Ireland (1923).

Library Ireland also is in the process of reproducing John O’Hart’s “Irish Pedigrees: or the Origin and Stem of the Irish Nation.” They are using the 5th edition of that work, which was published in 1892.

At the present time they have posted selected sections of the book. (If you can’t wait for the full transcription, the book is in the collection of the Sno-Isle Regional Library.)

**VICTORIAN RELIGIOUS
DENOMINATIONS IN
ENGLAND AND WALES**

The English Parliament adopted the Places of Worship Registration Act 1855, which required all places of worship, except those of the Established Church, to be certified to the Registrar-General on payment of a fee to the superintendent registrar of the local district.

If your family was still in the British Isles in Victorian times, you might want to check this list for the various non-conforming churches that were viable at the time of this listing. There are 89 separate entries on the list!

The list is the work of Stan Mapstone, who has been working on a single surname study of the Mapston Family, which arose in northeastern Somerset in the late 14th Century.

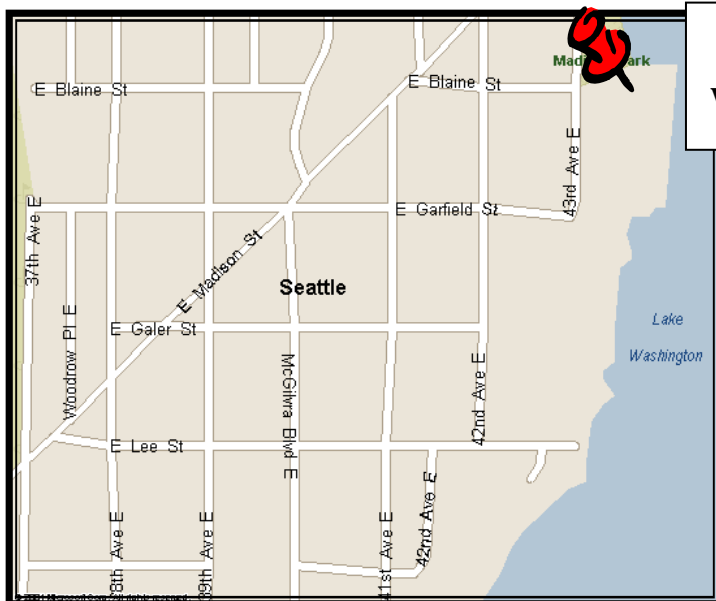
