SUCCESSFUL FIRST YEAR

HERITAGE TOURS FOR 1991

The annual research excursion to Salt Lake City is planned for the latter part of April and the first part of May. You will be able to take advantage of the expertise of tour genealogist, Arthur Fiske, who has been an active genealogist for over 46 years.

The major tour for 1991 will be in the latter part of September and first few days of October. The first stop will be Albany, NY for research at the New York State Library, then on to Philadelphia for opportunities in that area. Visit the Pennsylvania Historical Society Library (which also houses the collection of the Pennsylvania Genealogical Society), or go with us to Swarthmore College for Quaker records. There are many other opportunities for research in this region.

Baltimore, Maryland is also an important research area. The famed Peabody Library, the Maryland Historical Society, nearby Annapolis is the home of the Maryland Hall of Records, and there will be a visit to the Genealogical Publishing Company in Baltimore for book buying.

The researcher should not overlook the Mennonite Library outside of Lancaster, Pennsylvania. In this library we find not only Mennonite and other Anabaptist records, but a well-rounded and extensive collection of historical and genealogical works for general Pennsylvania research. We then visit the Pennsylvania State Library at Harrisburg.

The final days of the tour will be in Western Pennsylvania with research at Pittsburgh, Washington County and other centers of interest. On the journey from Harrisburg to Pittsburgh there will be opportunities to visit ancestral sites along the way and at midpoint, a visit to the historical Bedford Village.

Tour genealogist, Arthur Fiske, will be on hand for research assistance in all the libraries en route.

BOOK REVIEW

Among the many books at Fiske Library dealing with ancestral origins in England, an outstanding title is *Virginia Gleanings in England*. These are mainly abstracts of 17th and 18th Century Wills and Administrations relating to Virginia and Virginians. This work, compiled by genealogist Lothrop Withington, has an every-name index by Thomas L. Hollowak, greatly increasing its value to the researcher. Published by Genealogical Publishing Co., Baltimore, 1980, it contains 745 pages of data and continues to be an important reference for the Virginia genealogist.

When we consider the loss of records in Virginia, particularly for some of the major eastern counties, it is reassuring to learn of materials for research to be found in various repositories in the British Isles. Many of the documents abstracted in Withington's work are found at the Public Record Office, Chancery Lane, London, but the contents of a good percentage of the Virginia-related papers is found between the covers of "Virginia Gleanings."
