At this time it will open at the new location 1644 43rd Avenue East (the lower, or basement level). Pioneer Hall is South of Madison Park on Lake Washington, just north of Parkshore Retirement Home.

The FGF has enjoyed the use of the present facility for a number of years and thank the owners, Claudia and Robert Erdman for their kind support and friendship during this time.

We thank the Washington Pioneer Association and its board for making this move possible. We all agree that this move will mutually benefit both organizations. We welcome their use of the FGF classes and library .
